In 2017, a small group of funders came together to advance an idea: Virginia's philanthropic community could reach an unprecedented level of effectiveness if grantmakers across the state worked together to tackle the Commonwealth's most pressing needs and capitalize on opportunities. In 2020, the Virginia Funders Network was officially launched from this belief in the power of collaboration.

Since that time, our strength and effectiveness come directly from the diverse and valued insights, wisdom, perspectives, and dedication of over 130 members all across the Commonwealth who comprise our network. We are dedicated to working together to help ensure that all who call Virginia home, regardless of race, gender, age, ability or geography, have the resources they need to thrive.

Our Work

- Hosting dozens of learning and networking opportunities to help members learn from experts and each other. These events build community among the state's philanthropic leaders and provide a robust arena for idea exchange, collective problem-solving, and the development of collaborative solutions.
- Keeping members up to date on what's happening across the field of philanthropy, across Virginia, and across the issue areas impacting Virginia communities.
- Leveraging members' collective knowledge to create and curate useful tools and resources to help grantmaking organizations maximize their funding and impact.

Member Qualifications

Membership is open to any funder who makes grants for charitable, religious, educational, or scientific purposes in support of the residents of the Commonwealth. Members affirm that their core interest in joining VFN is to inform and improve their grantmaking through networking, collaboration, learning, and leverage. The Member category includes:

- Grantmaking organizations that make grants to multiple organizations in Virginia for charitable, religious, educational, or scientific purposes.
- Government or quasi-government offices that are also grantmakers.
- Organizations that do not restrict their giving solely to subsidiary chapters, member organizations, affiliates, or a single institution.
- Organizations that act as grantmaking intermediaries such as government entities, nonprofit organizations, initiatives, or collaboratives that grant or re-grant, private and/or public dollars.
- Individuals committed to sustained, strategic philanthropy through their own private grantmaking.

Value of Membership

VFN's strength is our ability to bring a Virginia lens to our work in support of the philanthropic community. As the only Virginia based philanthropic network, we serve as a convener for funders and their community, regional and statewide partners and provide the backbone for collaboration. Membership covers all of an organization's trustees, staff, and consultants. Members are eligible for the full spectrum of resources and services including:

- Access to VFN publications, member directory, and listservs.
- Service on VFN's Advisory Board and/or committees.
- Connection to funders in like roles with similar funding interests.
- Member pricing for the annual conference.
- Participation in learning events and regional funders gatherings.
- Support from VFN's dedicated staff.

Membership Rates

Our membership rates are one component of a financial model that includes a healthy balance of revenue between membership and philanthropic contributions, grants, sponsorships, and earned income. Membership rates are based on annual grantmaking in Virginia.

Community Foundations calculate their membership contribution based on discretionary annual grantmaking in Virginia. Distributions from Donor Advised Funds or grants from Supporting Organizations, who are eligible for their own membership, should not be included in this calculation. Virginia Funders Network Non-Solicitation Policy

The Virginia Funders Network provides a unique space and events where philanthropic leaders can gather, learn, share ideas, and seek the advice and input of their peers and colleagues. As such, at VFN events, solicitation, promotion, and fundraising of any kind to benefit a specific organization, event, or cause by members, partners, and/or guests is prohibited. This ensures a comfortable, respectful atmosphere in which professional relationships can be fostered and maintained. Notably, this shall not prohibit education, communication, and collaboration among funders for areas of mutual interest. Members understand that the CEO, Advisory Board members, and other VFN leadership, in their roles as fiduciaries, shall make members aware of funding opportunities that support VFN's strategic objectives.

The payment of dues by Members and Partners is acceptance of VFN's non-solicitation policy. Violators of this policy, as decided by VFN's Executive Committee, may be excluded from future VFN events and/or denied future membership.

VFN may invite representatives of the grantseeking community to join us as speakers, panelists, or guests at VFN events. We also ask these representatives to adhere strictly to our policy of non-solicitation. Invited nonprofit representatives who violate this policy, as decided by VFN's Executive Committee, may be excluded from future VFN events.
